BRIEFING NOTES FOR TEAM MANAGERS

General

The tournament will be played in accordance with the current Laws of Badminton, the General Competition Regulations (especially Appendix 5 – gambling/bedding), new ITTO in force 2018-01-01, Code of Conduct for Coaches and Team Officials and the Players' Code of Conduct.

Order of play

The order of play will be according to the matchlist. Matches will not be called more than 15 minutes in advance.

If there is a change in the time-schedule the Referee shall inform the team managers well in advance. The Quarter final matches will be scheduled in the afternoon on Saturday including the XD semi finals. Semi finals and finals for Sunday will be scheduled at Saturday evening.

Procedure before and after the match

There will be no marching on and off procedure of any kind up to and including quarter-finals.

From semi-finals on there will be a marching on procedure. The meeting point for starting the procedure is situated in the corner behind match control table. Match will be announced, umpire, players, servicejudge and linejudges (in this order) will go to the announced court.

Knocking up on court should not last longer than 2 minutes.

Players have to carry all equipments they need during the match.

During match, if the coach wants to pass anything to the players, the coaches should approach Referee.

Ceremonies

After the final matches umpire and players together will go back to the meetingpoint for starting the pricegiving ceremony. This ceremony is also for runner up of semifinals (third place prizes / medals). We would appreciate if those who runner ups can stay until the prize presentation directly after the final in their event. They will receive a medal and get a place on the podium, and the applause and pictures they deserve after a successful tournament

Shuttles

YONEX Aerosensa 50 shuttlecocks will be used exclusively.

The speed of the shuttle to be used will be decided upon by the Referee and he will carry out regular tests to adapt to any changes of conditions.

It is not allowed to test shuttles before and during the match. When there is a query about the speed of the shuttle, the player should ask the umpire and the umpire will take the appropriate action.

Towelling & drink during match

Players cannot leave the court without umpire's permission except during the intervals.

During the game, if play is not held up, the players can have quick towelling.

Players must ask umpire's permission for quick drink. If the court needs to be mopped, the players must be within the court when the mopping is over.

Injuries

In case of injury, the player should notify the umpire who will call the referee. Team Managers or other team officials are not allowed on court before the referee has said so. Please pay attention to the BWF regulation on blood flowing injuries. Because of the risk of infection with HIV, it is strongly recommended that play be stopped in such situations and an occlusive dressing (e.g. bandage or plaster) applied to the injury. It is also recommended that any plaster application shall be done by the tournament doctor or paramedic.

Coaching

Coaching is allowed when the shuttle is not in play. The regulations for coaches are:

- Coaches must sit in their designated chairs. There are coaches' chairs at both ends of the court.
 - Coaches should not cause any distraction or delay of play. If play is disrupted, the umpire will call a let and immediately inform the referee.
 - Coaching should not continue into the concentration fase proceeding the start of the next rally.
 - Coaches should leave court side immediately after the 20 seconds announcement.
 - Coaches should not go over the mats for coaching during intervals

Clothing

The rules try to ensure attractive presentation of the event. All clothing should be acceptable Badminton sports clothing. Each article may be of any colour or combination of colours. Doubles partners are recommended to wear the same colours in semi-finals and finals. It is optional for a player to have his name on the back of his shirt in main draw but it is mandatory for semi-finals and finals.

The umpire shall check before a match starts that clothing and advertising is correct; if not, he will ask the player to change. It is not allowed to wear shirts inside out or to tape advertising.

Players should use the clothing baskets to put their clothing during play. To ensure a proper presentation, players should keep the baskets together and close to the umpire's chair.

Advertising on clothing

The umpire should check the player's clothing before the start of the match and inform the Referee immediately in case of any violation against BWF GCR 19 to 23.

Conduct on court

Failure to complete a match, trying to influence the line judges, abuse of shuttle, verbal abuse, abuse of racket or equipment are unsportsmanlike conduct.

Drug testing

Drug testing can be carried during the competition.

Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) may be granted to a player permitting the use of a prohibited substance or method contained in the prohibited list.

WADA / BWF Regulations: 21 days

2 Types: ATUE & TUE

ATUE: Asthma Medication / Corticosteroids

TUE: Legitimate medical condition supported by Medical Expert Evidence

Age control

The referee shall have the power to check the player's age at any time. This can be done on referee's own initiative or by request from a third party. Photo identification (e.g. passport) is considered as being valid documentation for age check.
